Is It I, Lord?

We hear today of how Jesus comes into the life of his first Apostles, firstly Andrew and his friends and through them to Simon (and how he names him Peter, meaning “Rock”). We all surely know that this eventually leads to the foundation of the Church so that the work and message of Jesus can be taken to the whole world.

We may ask, “Why them?” Maybe the starting point is that they were searching in the first place. We know that Andrew and his companion were disciples of John the Baptist and it is clear that they must have taken his message, that he was opening a path for the Messiah, to heart. So when John points out Jesus to them they, very importantly, were ready to listen to the advice and guidance of John the Baptist. They then understood and took action. They went to Jesus, his word took root and then they started to spread the good news to others, starting with Peter.

Our First Reading reminds us that this process is not always as quick and instant as we read about in the Gospel. The passage is the abridged version but what happens is Samuel hears the voice of the Lord talking to him as he sleeps. He doesn't believe it is for him at first and it takes several times and eventually guidance from Eli the priest before he recognises the call for what it is.

We should perhaps wonder how many times we have heard the voice of the Lord calling to us and haven't recognised it for what it is. Sometimes, like Samuel and Andrew, we need to be prepared to heed the guidance of others and let the Word become active in us.
