### Better Together

One clear message in this weekend's readings is that community is a critically important aspect of our faith. In our First Reading, Ezra gathers the people of Jerusalem and reads the Torah to them so that they can rededicate themselves to God. Then, in our Gospel Reading, Jesus gathers the people of Nazareth in a similar way and reads a prophecy about the Messiah from the Book of Isaiah. He then proceeds to tell them: 'Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

As followers of Christ, we are all supposed to share in the sort of work this prophecy speaks about: proclaiming the good news; caring for the poor, the disabled and the downtrodden; helping to free people from bondage to sin and death. But we may not always feel up to the challenge. Individually, we're not very strong, and the whole world can seem to be against us. However, in today's Second Reading, St. Paul reminds us that we do not have to face these difficulties alone. The Church is Christ's mystical body, and if we have a strong connection to Christ and to each other, this can empower us to make a real positive difference—and possibly even to work miracles.

Every time we come to Church, we have the opportunity to gather together, to rededicate ourselves to God as a community, and to support each other in sharing Christ's work. We live in a very individualistic society, and a lot of people seem to have forgotten how vital this collective power is. Perhaps one of the things we should all work on is trying to remind them.
