Made for Belief

This year, during the Easter Vigil, several new members from our Partnership area were received into full communion with the Church. They were all asked to declare, "I believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches, and proclaims to be revealed by God."

This Sunday's gospel reading tackles a problem that the new members may have faced in the past or will face sometime in their lives: the very human problem of doubting our faith.

Because we are human most of our knowledge comes from the physical side of our nature. We see, hear touch etc. then we evaluate. We can be like the disciple Thomas in today's gospel. But this gospel reading reminds us that faith is trusting in God, not finding physical proofs.

At times having questions and doubts can mean we are honestly thinking about our faith. Ultimately it can make our faith in God stronger. As we know, Thomas <u>does</u> come to believe. And Doubting Thomas' faith *did* grow and deepen. Having come through a time of disbelief Thomas went on to become one of the greatest believers of the early Church.

What Jesus says in today's gospel is crucial for those of us who are believers yet sometimes have doubts: "Blessed are those who have <u>not seen</u> and yet have believed."

As many of you know this Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. Mercy was the hallmark of Jesus' life on earth. Throughout the gospels it was with mercy that he treated all people, with love and understanding. The famous picture of Jesus which we associate with the Divine Mercy has these words at the foot of the image, 'Jesus I trust in you'.

When things aren't going well in our life and we feel the Lord is absent it is helpful to remember to always trust in Jesus. Because in the end we weren't made for unbelief.

What is Gift Aid: By signing a Gift Aid Declaration we can reclaim 25p for every £1 you donate to the parish. If for example you were to give £5 a week through Gift Aid the parish would obtain an annual income tax refund of £65. You don't have to be paying a lot of tax to join the Gift Aid Scheme – only sufficient to cover the basic rate tax the parish will reclaim. Providing you pay tax on your salary or pension you can join the scheme. If you are a taxpayer and not in the Gift Aid Scheme the parish is effectively losing out on "free money" from the Government. Am I Eligible - In order to sign a Gift Aid Declaration you must be a UK taxpayer, and donate either by standing order or by weekly envelopes so that your contributions can be recorded
