The reality of suffering

Today marks the beginning of Holy Week, commemorating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and the events leading up to his crucifixion. Perhaps today we could reflect on the following themes:

Abandonment and Isolation: Today's Psalm is a lamentation, expressing feelings of abandonment, isolation, and despair. Yet, it also includes expressions of trust and hope in God's deliverance and salvation. It is a powerful prayer resonating with those who have experienced deep suffering. The responsorial psalm reflects Jesus' feeling of abandonment and isolation on the cross. It reminds us of the reality of suffering, and the importance of acknowledging and processing our emotions during painful times.

Taking the Difficult Path: Jesus' journey to the cross was not easy, yet he remained steadfast in his commitment to God's plan. This theme emphasises perseverance and faithfulness in our own lives, even when the path is challenging.

Suffering: We read about the events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion, including the Last Supper, his arrest, trial, and eventual crucifixion. The Passion narrative reveals the shame and suffering associated with this form of execution and underscores Jesus' immense love for humanity. There is also an acknowledgement in today's readings that suffering is necessary as a means of growth and transformation. Jesus suffered and died for each of us, revealing the depth of his love, so that we could know life.

As we receive palm crosses or branches today, let them remind us that Christ is the King of our families, our hearts, and the true answer to our quest for happiness and meaning in life.

General Notices Around the Partnership

Partnership - Sacrament of Reconciliation: St Patrick's, Consett; Saturday after 10am Mass. Our Lady and St Joseph's Brooms on Saturday's before the 5.30pm Vigil Mass 4.45pm-5.15pm.

What is Gift Aid: By signing a Gift Aid Declaration we can reclaim 25p for every £1 you donate to the parish. If for example you were to give £5 a week through Gift Aid the parish would obtain an annual income tax refund of £65. You don't have to be paying a lot of tax to join the Gift Aid Scheme – only sufficient to cover the basic rate tax the parish will reclaim. Providing you pay tax on your salary or pension you can join the scheme. If you are a taxpayer and not in the Gift Aid Scheme the parish is effectively losing out on “free money” from the Government.

Am I Eligible - In order to sign a Gift Aid Declaration you must be a UK taxpayer, and donate either by standing order or by weekly envelopes so that your contributions can be recorded
