A Mystery of Love

This weekend, the Church celebrates one of its core dogmas: that **three** distinct divine persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—are somehow united so closely as to be only **one** God. Since this seems to be a contradiction from the perspective of human logic, the temptation for all of us is to simply write it off as a "Mystery of Faith", something that we accept not because we understand it, but because the Bible—and especially the teachings of Christ—reveal it to us.

However, God may be calling us to engage with this truth more deeply than that. It's worth noting that the word 'mystery' originally comes to us from ancient Greek. And when the Greeks used it, they weren't talking about a logical or theological puzzle. They were actually describing a rite of initiation, a mystical experience that yielded some sort of deeper wisdom about the divine. It wasn't something to be "solved". It was something that people engaged in and then contemplated in order to grow in understanding.

In addition to telling us about the Trinity, the Bible also tells us that "God is love". So, contemplating our experience of love in this world might help us to understand. To begin with, we will probably all recognise that love is a **unifying** force. When we love other people (e.g., our families, etc.) we start to identify them with ourselves. We say that they are a part of us. Of course, our love doesn't unite us perfectly because we don't love perfectly. But God does. And it stands to reason that perfect love **would** unite perfectly. So, the Trinity is not a completely illogical proposition after all.

The Christian faith isn't just a set of abstract beliefs. It's an invitation to use our whole lives to contemplate the deep truth of God by sharing more and more deeply in the perfect love of Christ. The more Christ-like we become in the love that we give to God and each other, the more we will come to understand all the mysteries of God, including the Trinity.
