# **Humility & Welcome**

In today's Gospel, Jesus turns a simple meal into a masterclass in humility and welcome. At a Pharisee's table, he notices how guests compete eagerly for honour, and gently urges them to take the lowest seat - reminding us that "all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted."

Jesus then shifts the focus from self-promotion to self-giving. He instructs hosts to invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind - those who cannot repay the favour. In doing so, he reshapes our understanding of generosity: true hospitality does not keep score, but offers dignity without expectation.

This message still speaks powerfully to us. In our own gatherings: family dinners, office lunches, online forums - how often do we seek attention, or cling to "our place"? Jesus calls us instead to notice those on the margins, to pull up a chair for the overlooked, and to see in every person the face of Christ.

As you go through this week, perhaps look for one concrete way to live this Gospel. Perhaps it's sharing a meal with someone who feels alone, quietly stepping aside to let another shine, or simply offering your time without strings attached. In every humble gesture, God meets us and raises us up.
