The heart that God sees

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable that cuts straight to the heart of what it means to be truly righteous before God. Two men go up to the temple to pray - one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stands tall, listing his religious achievements and comparing himself favourably to others. The tax collector, on the other hand, stands at a distance, unable to lift his eyes to heaven, and simply prays, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Jesus concludes with a powerful reversal: "I tell you, this man went home justified, rather than the other." It's a striking reminder that God sees not just our actions, but the posture of our hearts.

The Pharisee's prayer is full of pride. He's not really speaking to God - he's speaking about himself. His righteousness is self-made, and his confidence comes from comparison. The tax collector, however, comes with humility, aware of his need for mercy. He doesn't defend himself or make excuses. He simply asks for grace.

This parable challenges us to examine our own hearts. Do we approach God with humility, or do we rely on our own sense of goodness? Do we compare ourselves to others, or do we stand before God in truth?

It also reminds us that no one is beyond the reach of God's mercy. The tax collector, despised and rejected by society, is the one who receives justification. God's grace is not earned - it is received by those who know they need it.

In our prayer life, in our relationships, and in our service, let us seek the humility of the tax collector. Let us come before God not with pride, but with openness. For it is the humble heart that God lifts up, and the contrite spirit that he draws near.

This week, may we pray with honesty, live with humility, and extend mercy to others as we ourselves have received it. And may we remember that the most powerful prayer is often the simplest: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."
