### **There may be trouble ahead**

Our readings this week are full of warnings. The prophet Malachi warns of a day of judgement that will surely come. Saint Paul has words for those who do not contribute to the good of society when he writes to the Thessalonians; basically, stop causing bother for others if you wish to be part of the community. He calls on people to be active participants in the faith community rather than critical bystanders. Then in the Gospel those around Jesus are admiring the temple in Jerusalem in all its glory. However he tells his disciples that a day will come when all this physical beauty will be gone. Then a time will come when they will have to stand witness for their beliefs in times of great trouble. He also gives them assurance that he will give them the words and eloquence they need at that time.

As always our readings call us to examine where we stand in all of this. What sort of Witness do we give? What sort of contribution do we make to building God's kingdom? How will we be judged when the time comes? These are hard questions. We might feel that we come up short more often than not. But we are able to look at ourselves and think "how might we do better?" If we think it is all too difficult perhaps we can compare our situation to the disciples listening to Jesus and be thankful we don't face the same threats that Jesus warned them about.

So as we end the Church's year and prepare to enter the Advent season, a time of reflection and penance, we can look at ourselves. What are the things we can do better and how are we going to make them happen? Do we have the endurance to win our lives?
