As we reach the third Sunday of Advent there is a call to rejoice. It might be reasonable to ask "Why now?". After all, the event that we are happy about, the incarnation of Jesus, hasn't happened yet. Christmas is just under two weeks away, we aren't quite there.

But it is in human nature to celebrate in hope. If someone gets a new job or a promotion we congratulate them, well before we know if it all works out. Perhaps the most obvious, and relevant, is when we hear the news that a baby is on the way. It can and should be a time of great joy, a new person will join us sooner rather than later. We know there can be many dangers along the way but that generally doesn't stop us, we celebrate in expectation, prepare in hope.

The prophet Isaiah likens that joy to the blossoming of flowers in the wilderness, the "desert bloom". It brings to mind those films of plants bursting into life, from seed to flower, in a matter of hours after the rains fall. Brown and dusty lands turning into yellow, pink, white and purple overnight.

Of course what happens is that when the rains cease the flowers die back and everything goes back to normal. Perhaps the message for those of us who only approach Christ around the time of His birth is that if we wish to sustain our joy, to allow it to grow deeper roots, we need more regular contact. We need to allow our faith to be watered and fed through the year. We need to make the joy of the season a permanent presence in our lives.
