Ecce Agnus Dei

In today's Gospel (John 1:29-34), John the Baptist points to Jesus and proclaims, *'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.'* These words are familiar to us from every Mass, yet they carry profound meaning. John identifies Jesus not simply as a teacher or prophet, but as the sacrificial Lamb – the one who will offer himself for our redemption. This title recalls the Passover lamb of Exodus, whose blood saved Israel from death. In Christ, that saving act is fulfilled perfectly: his blood brings freedom from sin and opens the way to eternal life.

Notice John's humility: *'I myself did not know him... but for this purpose I came baptising with water, so that he might be revealed to Israel.'* John's mission was not about himself, but about revealing Christ. His example challenges us to ask: Do our words and actions point others to Jesus, or to ourselves? In a world that prizes self-promotion, John reminds us that true greatness lies in directing attention to the Lord.

The Responsorial Psalm echoes this call: *'Behold, I have come, Lord, to do your will.'* To behold the Lamb is not passive; it invites a response. Like John, we are called to witness – to recognise Christ's presence and share him with others. This begins with openness: listening to God's voice, surrendering our plans, and allowing his Spirit to guide us.

As we continue in Ordinary Time, let us make it anything but ordinary. Each day offers a chance to behold the Lamb of God in the Eucharist, in Scripture, and in the faces of those around us. May we, like John, testify: *'I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God.'* And may our lives echo that truth with joy and conviction!
