### Love First

When we hear about Jesus being baptised by John a lot goes on to be just described in one paragraph. John's initial reluctance and the insistence of Jesus that it should happen; there is a lot to think about there. Then the baptism itself: how can you spiritually clean the one who is without stain? Are we led to the symbolism of the act: pointing to the time Jesus will spend in the tomb before his resurrection? Question upon question.

We then encounter the immense power of God displayed as the heavens are opened and the spirit of God descends upon Jesus like a dove. The dove, a symbol of new beginnings, just like the one that told Noah the flood was over and life would begin anew. The dove, a sign of hope for those who have been, who still are, drowning in darkness.

And then those words, the voice from Heaven: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Just pause a while. This is the first we hear of the adult Jesus, the very beginning of his ministry. He hasn't done anything yet but still we hear the words of affirmation from the Father. In all the power and the glory there is a very simple message in there that applies to all of us. God loves us. Not for what we have done or who we are, He just loves us. He loves us like a parent loves their child. The world keeps telling us to prove ourselves. Every single day. But the voice of heaven interrupts and reminds us that love comes first before anything else.
