Actions Speak Louder Than Words

In the Gospel for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Matthew 21:28-32), Jesus tells the parable of two sons. When their father asks them to work in the vineyard, one refuses but later changes his mind and goes. The other readily agrees but never follows through. Jesus asks a simple question: 'Which of the two did the will of the father?'

This parable reminds us that God is interested not only in what we say, but in how we live. It is easy to make good intentions, speak the right words, or appear faithful on the surface. Yet discipleship is ultimately measured by our response to God's call in daily life. The Lord looks beyond appearances and sees the true disposition of our hearts.

The first son gives us hope. Although he initially says 'no,' he later repents and does what is right. We all have times when we resist God's will, fail to live up to our calling, or take the wrong path. The good news is that God's mercy always leaves room for conversion. It is never too late to turn back and begin again.

The second son serves as a warning against complacency. Faith cannot remain merely a matter of words, promises, or outward observance. It must bear fruit in acts of love, compassion, forgiveness, and service.

As we gather for the Eucharist this week, let us ask the Lord for the grace to be faithful not only in speech but also in action. May our lives reflect the Gospel we profess, and may our daily choices reveal hearts that are willing to follow Christ wherever he leads.
